Overview

U.S. Memorial Day Decoration Day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • U.S. Memorial Day – A federal holiday honoring those who died while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Originally known as ‘Decoration Day’; a day when flowers were used to decorate Civil War graves ○ In 1868, a national veteran’s organization formally established May 30th as ‘Decoration Day’ ○ Between 1873-1890, ‘Decoration Day’ became a state holiday across the U.S. ○ After WWI, the name ‘Memorial Day’ began to gradually replace ‘Decoration Day’ ○ In 1967, Congress officially designated May 30th as ‘Memorial Day’ across the United States ○ In 1971, ‘Memorial Day’ switched to the last Monday in May (per the Uniform Monday Holiday Act) • Memorial Day is also considered the unofficial beginning of summer in the United States
Memorial Day Symbols & Traditions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Memorial Day Symbols & Traditions <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ American Flag: Flags are flown at half-staff until noon, then at full-staff for the rest of the day ○ Red Poppies: Red poppies commemorate war dead (inspired by the WWI poem ‘In Flanders Fields’) ○ Moment of Remembrance: At 3PM local time, observe a U.S. national moment of remembrance ○ Visit national military cemeteries and war memorials to honor deceased military members ○ Place flags at veteran’s graves ○ Attend parades featuring military personnel and veterans ○ Hold family gatherings & picnics to kick-off the summer and enjoy hard-won national freedoms
